






### Introductions


#### Petra, Jordan

- Inscribed 1985
- Settled by the Nabateans
- Most prosperous in 1<sup>st</sup> Century AD
- Under Roman Rule in 2<sup>nd</sup>
   Century AD
- Criteria: (i)(iii)(iv)

## Archeological Site of Delphi, Greece


- Inscribed in 1987
- Mount Parnassus, Phocis, Greece
- Temple of the Delphic Apollo
- Oracle of Delphi
- Criteria: (i)(ii)(iii)(iv)(vi)

- 1.2 kilometres long
- Ends at the Al-Khazneh
- Water channels and niches

- Pilgrimage to Oracle




# Cross-Cultural Influence
